We are now just 6 short months away from our 5th annual Cleveland ConCoction convention. One of the constant concerns we've heard from you over the past several years has been the lack of easy parking at our original site hotel, the Airport Sheraton. Reasons for the parking chaos were varied, but included airport construction, airport site fees, holiday travel chaos, and at least one Presidential visit. We don't have control over these situations, but we did the best we could to find solutions. We are incredibly grateful to the Airport Sheraton staff for taking care of our Attendees and our Community these past several years and are grateful for the time we're worked together to make the Airport Sheraton into a small temporary geek oasis. But the time has come for a major change, and in this case that means moving onward our new event site: The Bertram Inn & Conference Center in Aurora. Although shifting sites will be a challenge, The Bertram offers us several advantages, not the least of which is plenty of free parking (at last!) We know this is a huge change, and more details will be coming soon concerning the move, so all we ask is that you bear with us as we adapt to the new location.

Cleveland ConCoction has always been a volunteer organization, from the Board of Directors out to the person working the information booth. Each year there are changes in leadership and the makeup of the teams that bring their own unique skills, backgrounds and interests to share with all of us, as well as those Volunteers who may work with them. If you find yourself at one of our events, be it a game day, a convention, a social outing, or otherwise and you're having a good time, please take a moment to thank our volunteers. Many of them use personal days from work or family vacation time to share the love of ConCoction and Cleveland Fandom with all of Us, and they deserve a high-five for doing the work that makes every event a success.

Hotel

Hello ConCoctioneers. This is Eric Hogg, your Hotel Liaison for all things ConCoction.

In the five and a half months since the last convention we have been working hard on several things. One of those things has been the location of Cleveland ConCoction. We've done several polls, both in person and online, and by far the most commented on thing was the parking at the Cleveland Airport Sheraton. Or more specifically, the lack of parking.

So we decided that if at all possible, it was time to say goodbye to that location. One of the prevailing issues with moving ConCoction has always been the amount of event space we need. There are, quite simply, no other locations in Cuyahoga County, without going downtown, that have he amount of space we need to throw the event you have come to expect. (A quick aside on the downtown thing. There ARE, in fact, several facilities in downtown Cleveland that could potentially meet our needs. But they are all REALLY expensive. We would have to increase prices and parking rates to even consider a move like that.). So we went looking elsewhere.

What we found is an awesome little hotel/ conference center in Aurora called The Bertram. The Bertram actually has a bit more function space than the Sheraton.
So that is where we are having Cleveland ConCoction 2018.

The two biggest factors in this decision have been the amount of space available, and the number of parking spots. As I said above, the Bertram has a bit more space, that is more versatile than the Sheraton. The Bertram also has nearly 1000 dedicated parking spaces, and they are absolutely free to use.




